



1. Question: *Is the Symposium In-Person Only?*

Answer: As a rule, yes, the symposium is in-person only. This is in keeping with the primary mission of the symposium, which is to bring all those interested in military history together to interact professionally and socially. However, especially for those who wish to present from outside the United States, we are open to making exceptions on a case-by-case basis.

Answer: The symposium is hosted on the campus of Kansas State University and at the Eisenhower Library and archives, but we do have two hotel partners who provide us with a block of rooms and reduced rates for our attendees.
